Dear Forensics Colleague,

Thank you so much for joining us for the 2015 ASU Southwest Championship! On behalf of the ASU Forensics team and the Hugh Downs School of Communication, we would like to welcome you to our beautiful campus. We value your participation and if there is anything we can do to help make your tournament experience more worthwhile, please don't hesitate to let us know. This year's tournament has some of the largest debate divisions at the SWC in recent memory, with over 74 schools and 8 states represented.

We wanted to provide you with some logistical information.

Tournament Headquarters: Social Science Building (SS).

Student Help Desk: LSA 191

Parking information: On Thursday and Friday, you can pay to park in Lot 20 Visitor Parking located on the northwest corner of campus on University & Mill. This lot will remain open until 10pm. On Saturday, you can park for free in the 10th Street structure off Myrtle Avenue on the northwest end of campus, the Apache Boulevard structure in the south central portion of campus, or the Tyler Street or Rural Road structures on the East side of campus. The Apache and Rural Road structures are also open for paid visitor parking on Thursday/Friday but they close at 9pm.

Bus drop off information: Closest to tournament HQ: The Myrtle/10th Street L on the Northwest side of campus. Next closest: north section of McAlister Avenue, runs through eastern half of campus. Least convenient: Forest Avenue L, southwest corner of campus. NOTE: if your bus needs to park near campus during the day, Lot 3 (This is the Gammage parking lot on southwest corner of campus off Apache/Forest) and Lot 20 (Northwest portion of campus at University/Mill intersection) are both available.

We are pleased to be able to once again have the entire campus at our disposal for the tournament. As a result, this is the largest iteration of the Southwest Championship yet. We have done our best to consolidate various events to buildings in close proximity to one another

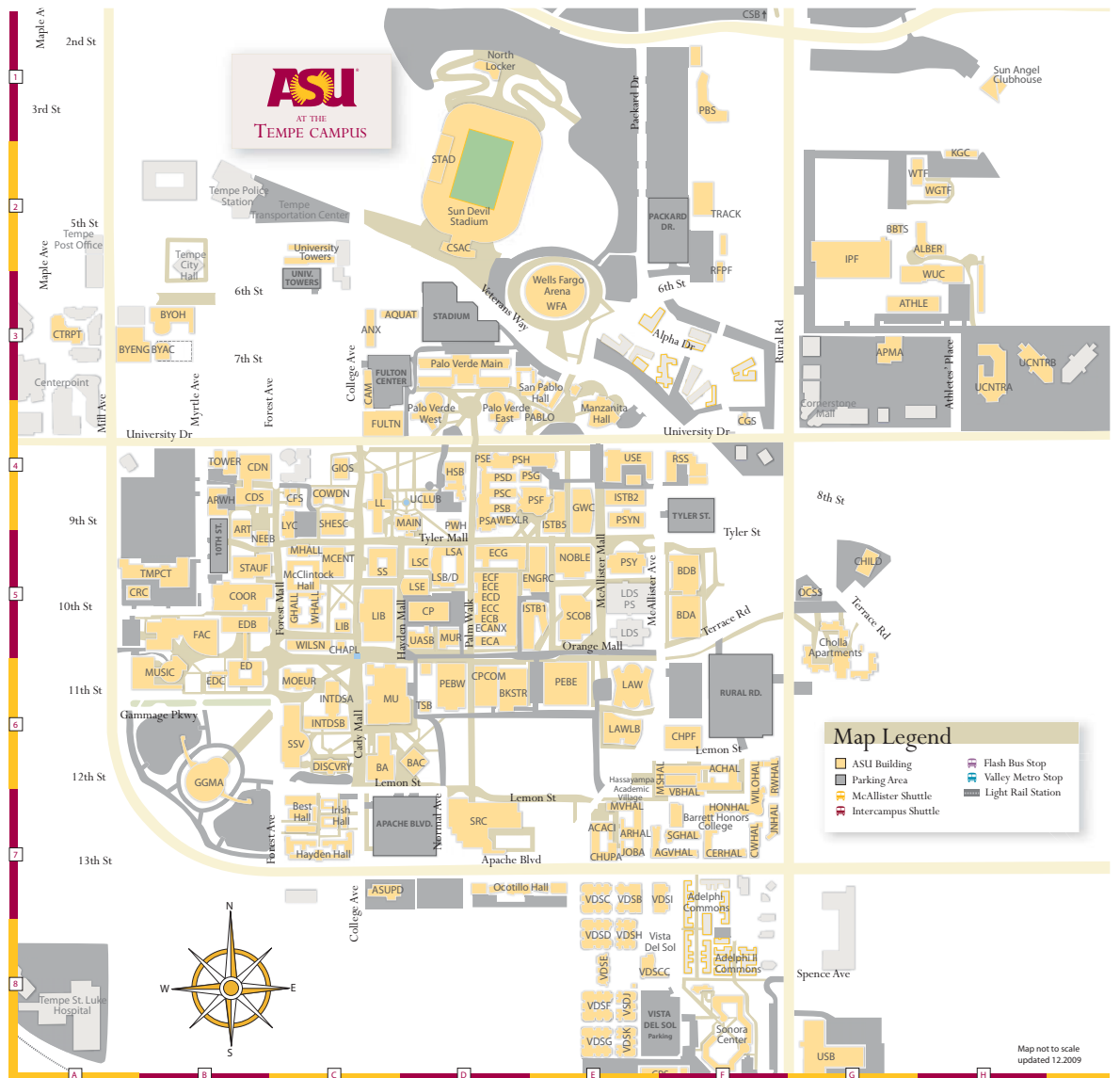
